2025 AGM CHANGES:

Maid Marian has been running successfully since the winter overhaul and crews have been adapting to the new Polish coal that the Railway has had to purchase when the previous supply of Welsh steam coal ran out. Unfortunately this is much smokier than the previous coal and requires a different firing technique as it burns more quickly and produces more smoke and smuts. In the dry weather prior to the early May Bank Holiday there were problems with hot ashes being ejected, causing lines-side fires on the final ascent of Dolfawr Bank, though this did not adversely affect Maid Marian!

FUND-RAISING REPORT:

Your Secretary and your Fund-raising Officer attended the Late May Bank Holiday weekend, as advertised in the May Progress Report.
